A. Vanini Reports On Gold Mining

A. Vanini of San Francisco, president of the Providence Mine, near Tuolumne City, gave out the following report this week on gold mining and an interesting report on the Providence Mine, while here on a business trip.

The War Production Board has stated recently that it still intends to void L-208, or lift ban on gold mining within a short period as possible and within three months at the most, of V-E Day. Tuolumne County expects many of its gold mines to be reopened, including the famous Providence Mine, well known by old residents here to have been among its best producers.

The corporation is Providence Tuolumne Gold Mines, Inc., and headed by A. Vanini, treasurer and general manager, San Francisco. First work will consist of installation of electric power line and modern equipment to extend the drifts on the vein heretofore intersected by a crosscut tunnel, both to the north and to the south along the vein to open up and develop at depth ore bodies found in the upper workings.

As the ore bodies are reached, to will continue to drift in order to determine the length of the ore body and to crosscut the vein to further determine its width and value and to make raise and install chutes for practical mining

and extraction of the ore. Milling equipment is planned as soon as most suitable method for treatment of ores can be determined. The Providence consists of 110 acres with a 1470 foot shaft and 9850 feet of tunnels. Over one million dollars worth of gold ore is reported to be blocked out. Property has been kept in shape to permit immediate resumption of operation as soon as gold mining ban is removed.
